Summary

Ida Alison Browne lectured in palaeontology at the University of Sydney from 1935 to 1950, before working jointly with her husband, William Rowan Browne, a renowned geologist.

She was educated at Fort Street Girls' High School in Sydney, before attending the University of Sydney where, in 1922, she graduated with a Bachelor of Science, with First Class Honours. She was awarded the University Medal in geology. In 1932, she was awarded a Doctorate of Science.

Later in her career, she served as a Member of the Australian National Research Council.

Appointed Assistant Lecturer in palaeontology at the University of Sydney

Demonstrator in geology, University of Sydney.

Member of the Linnean Society from 1924, councillor (1941-50) and president (1945-46).

Member of the Royal Society from 1935, vice-president (1942-50), honorary editorial secretary (1950-53) and president (1953-54)

Promoted to Lecturer

Promoted to Senior Lecturer

1927 - 1927
Received a Linnean Macleay fellowship, which she used to undertake geological investigation of the South Coast

1950 - 1970
Resigned and instead worked from home with her husband William Rowan Browne, a renowned geologist

1934 - 1934
Returned to demonstrating at the University of Sydney
