With her friend Nora Weston, Eirene Mort set up a graphic design studio in Sydney in 1906 where lessons were offered in craft, drawing, design, wood carving, metalwork and book-binding. The emphasis was upon Australian subject matter in design.

Mort was a founder of the Society of Arts and Crafts of New South Wales. She wrote and illustrated articles for the Sydney *Mail* and *Art and Architecture*, and illustrated several books including Florence Sulman's *A Popular Guide to the Wild Flowers of New South Wales* (1913), her own *The Story of Architecture* (1942), and her brother Selwyn Mort's *Coins of the Hapsburg Emperors* 1619-1919.
